SET is a card game requiring a special deck in which players must take sets of three cards off of a field of 12 or more cards laying face up. Once a set is taken, three more cards are added to the field. It is conceivable, that no sets exist within a group of twelve, although this is rare. In this case, three more cards are added to the field. The card game is a multi-player one, whose object is to gather the most sets by the time the deck is exhausted.

A 'Set' is 3 cards in which each individual feature is either all the SAME on each card... OR all DIFFERENT on each card. That is to say, any feature in the 'Set' of three cards is either common to all three cards or is different on each card.

The Features are:

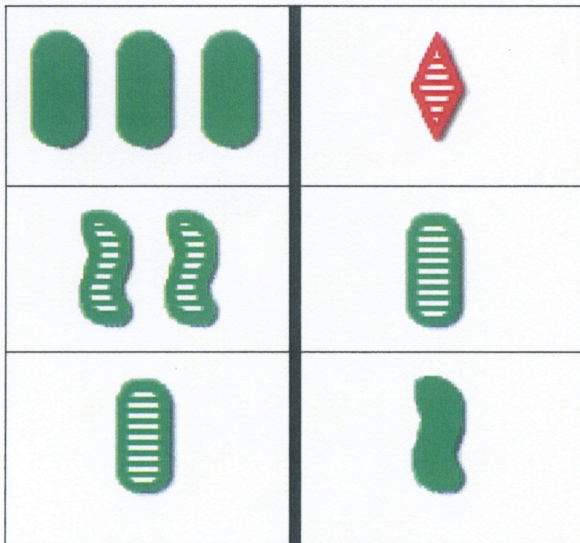
Symbols: Each card has ovals, squiggles, or diamonds on it;

Color: The symbols are red, green, or purple;

Number: Each card has one, two, or three symbols on it;

Shading: The symbols are solid, striped or open.
