RUBY CHENG GOYA

Dr. Ruby Cheng is an active soloist and chamber musician in the Southern California area. She has collaborated with the Los Angeles Philharmonic, and has appeared as soloist with the Young Musicians Foundation Debut Orchestra, and the Music Academy of the West Festival Orchestra. Her performances have been broadcast on Santa Barbara's KDB 93.7 classical radio. She has given recitals throughout North America, including at the Aspen Music Festival, Music Academy of the West, Sarasota, Banff Centre for the Arts, and Harvard University, including the Wednesday at One series at Alice Tully Hall with cellist Alisa Weilerstein. As a chamber musician, Dr. Cheng has been heard on series throughout Southern California at the South Bay Chamber Music Society, Dana Point Coastal Arts, Concertos Pomeridiano, and The Previews at Trinity Lutheran Church, and at the Coleman and Fischhoff National Chamber Music Competitions where she was a finalist and semi-finalist.

Influential teachers include Ick Choo and Hae-Young Moon, Mark Richman, Jerome Lowenthal, Marc Durand, and Walter Ponce. Dr. Cheng received her BM, MM, and DMA degrees from Juilliard and UCLA, and is currently an adjunct faculty member in piano at Chapman University. She also maintains a private piano studio in Rancho Penasquitos.

ROBERT ZELICKMAN

Robert Zelickman, clarinetist, is a Lecturer of Music at UC San Diego where he has taught since 1983. In addition to teaching clarinet and performing contemporary music, Robert conducts the UCSD Wind Ensemble and lectures on Jewish Music. Besides his duties at the University, Robert can be seen in many other venues throughout the community. He was a member of Orchestra Nova San Diego for 23 years and has performed with the San Diego Symphony and the San Diego Opera. Robert is also well known throughout California as the co-director of the Second Avenue Klezmer Ensemble. Zelickman earned his BA at UCLA and a MFA at Cal Arts. He has studied with Hugo Raimondi, Michele Zukovsky and Ronald Rueben. Robert was Bass Clarinetist with the Mexico City Philharmonic (1978-1979) and the Vera Cruz Symphony (1980-1982).
